#### Today We Welcome Our Guest Preacher Rev. Dr. Margaret Grun Kibben Rear Admiral, Chaplain Corps, US Navy (Ret.) Chaplain, US House of Representatives

Chaplain Kibben, the 61st Chaplain of the United States House of Representatives, served over thirty years in the United States Navy, completing her career as the U.S. Navy's 26th Chief of Chaplains. Her career spans both Navy and Marine Corps assignments serving both ashore, at sea, and abroad to include a combat-tour in Afghanistan.

Dr. Kibben is a graduate of Goucher College and received both her Master of Divinity and her Doctor of Ministry from Princeton Theological Seminary. She served as a Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace and holds a master's degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College.
