ANNOUNCEMENTS

Session Update

At the December meeting the Session:

- 1. Reviewed and retained the mask policy for worship. The Session decided to maintain the policy of masks in worship until a further review in January. In making its decision, Session considered the following:
 - Ramifications of the Omicron variant are as yet unknown;
 - Children are still in the process of receiving the vaccine;
 - Crowds at Christmas services will be larger and closer;
 - While DC has dropped its mandates, it has also increased its warnings for organizations to be watchful;
 - Montgomery County recently reversed its "no mask needed" policy;
 - The winter season increases seasonal viruses.
- 2. Presented Mary Jo Pera with the Duane Barney Award in recognition of extraordinary accomplishment by a lay leader at NPC. Elder Pera shepherded the Facility Master Planning process and the 2020-21 facilities renovation at great personal sacrifice.
- 3. Approved Resettling an Afghan Refugee family. Timing may be any time in the next 12 months in cooperation with our partner organization, Lutheran Social Services.
- 4 Reviewed a first draft of the NPC 2022 budget.
