- Paul's message of Jesus as Messiah received a mixed reception in each city he visited. As you read this week, note how those who opposed it felt and acted. What did they fear? What role does fear play in our culture's experience of faith? Your faith?
- What do you learn about the relationship between faith and suffering from Paul's life and the church at Thessalonica (p. 416ff.)? How might this help you to endure trials and suffering in your life?
- Paul warns the Galatians about trying to obey their way to God's favor. What is the difference between trying to keep God's law on your own power and allowing the Holy Spirit to bring the fruit of the spirit through you?
