## Apocalypse Now: The Challenge of Revelation Week 8—Revelation 17:1-19:10 November 2, 2022

## I. Review

- A. The Focus of the message is Jesus Christ (1)
- B. The exalted Lord in the heavenly throne room (ch. 4–5)
- C. Three series of seven visions portray judgment as disasters
  - 1. Seals
  - 2. Trumpets
  - 3. Bowls
- D. Pattern: 1 thru 4 disaster; 5 intensification; 6 devastation
  - 1. Interlude to encourage the faithful follows each series.
- E. Revelation 12-14 envision Christ's victory over the devil.
  - 1. Dragon Seeks to Devour Baby; it is Foiled.
  - 2. Expelled from Heaven, wreaks earthly havoc.
  - 3. Uses two beasts: Sea and Land
    - a) Both are imitations of the Lamb
    - b) Mark of the beast: 666
  - 4. Real Salvation and Real Judgment are revealed
- F. Chapters 15 & 16. End of history; vision of seven bowls.
  - 1. Intensified repetitions of the previous sets of seven visions.
  - 2. The final cataclysm is set: the place called "Armageddon."
    - a) Uncertainty surrounding identity of this place.
    - b) Great reversal of history (cf. II Kings 23).
  - 3. 7<sup>th</sup> Bowl. Signals total judgment. "It is done" (finished).

- II. Revelation 17 is the account of Rome's destruction.
  - A. Vss. 1-8 John uses some very powerful images/metaphors.
    - 1. Whore. Rome. Adultery.
  - B. The whore sits on the beast.
    - 1. Alluring until you see what is in her golden goblet.
    - 2. Mark on forehead... drunk with the blood of the saints.
  - C. Rome is the city set on 7 hills—the well-known trademark.
  - D. Rome entices Christians away from commitment to Christ.
  - E. Eventually, and regardless of what the symbols actually mean, evil turns in on itself.
- III. Revelation 18:1-19:10 describes the fall of Babylon (Rome).
  - A. John shows us fall of Rome from perspective of those who had grown powerful and rich.
  - B. 19:1-5 Songs of praise: wedding banquet of Christ & Church
    - 1. OT saw relationship b/n God people as "marital."
    - 2. 19:6-8. NT sees Church as the bride of Christ.
    - 3. Matthew 22:1-14. Kingdom is like a wedding feast
  - C. 19:9-10. Seven Visions of the End. Don't worship angels!

## IV. Conclusion

- A. Revelation is a warning for believers as much as it is for non-believers.
- B. Babylon represents the idolatry any nation commits when it elevates material abundance, military prowess, technological sophistication, imperial grandeur, racial pride and any other glorification of the creature over the Creator.
