Confessing and Believing: The Apostles' Creed as Challenge and Gift for Faithful Daily Living Teacher: Dr. Quinn Fox Location: Chapel and online Zoom: click here or visit our Classes page We say the Apostle's Creed most every Sunday in Worship. We challenge our Second Grade Sunday School classes to memorize it as a "milestone in worship." But the creed has a far greater role to play in our lives than an occasional summary of our Christian belief (assuming we believe—or understand—all that is in it!). Join us for as we delve into "what has been believed everywhere, always and by all" in a way that seeks to address the intellectual and cultural contexts of the 21st Century, so that our confessing and believing using the words of the Creed might take on new and renewed meaning.

Matthew: The Promised Messiah Has Come (continued) Teaching team: Donna Duss, Margaret Gardner, Holly Novak Location: Garden Room C

Following the N. T. Wright Bible Study series, *Matthew for Everyone*, this class will continue the conversation about gospel presentations of Jesus' life and teaching. Matthew's gospel portrays Jesus as the promised Messiah of Israel, the king who will rule and save the entire world. Jesus's teachings build on and surpass those of Moses and his life fulfills Scripture's promise of salvation. Matthew's telling establishes the authority of Jesus as the Son of Man who sacrifices his life for all. His gospel also invites us to follow Christ's new way toward a transformed life.

Using primarily Dr. Jemar Tisby's book <u>The</u> <u>Color of Compromise: The Truth about the</u> <u>American Church's Complicity in Racism</u>, this class will examine history to understand our own situation and opportunities for creative action.
