 - 5. No more night (21:5)
 - 6. Also missing: Cowardly, unbelieving, vile, murderers, etc. (21:8)
 - B. The New Jerusalem (21:9-27)
 - 1. Descends from heaven (21:10)

- 2. The gates, material and dimensions of the city (21:12-21).
 - a. 12 gates, 12 angels, 12 tribes, 12 foundations 12 apostles (21:14)
 - b. 12,000 stadia (1,500 miles) cubed (21:15-17)
 - c. Jasper, pure gold, adorned w/ precious gems (21:18-21)
- No temple, no sun, no moon, no stars; Glory of God and the Lamb are the light (21:22-24)
- 4. Gates always open (21:25-27)
- C. Eden restored—yet better (22:1-5)
 - 1. River of the water of life; the Tree of Life (22:1-2)
 - 2. No more curse; See God's face and name (22:3-4)
 - 3. No more night (22:5)
