Scripture Reading for January 6 – 12, 2020

Luke 10:25-11:54

Questions for Reflection

- Consider the summary of the law given by the lawyer. Is the last phrase—about loving your neighbor—an adequate statement? How does the parable Jesus told guard against a misinterpretation of the summary?
- Who is your neighbor? How can you prove yourself to be a neighbor?
- Martha and Mary were concerned about different things. Which did Jesus consider the more important? How did he address the tension between the two of them?
- How does Jesus' power over the demonic further reveal his identity?
- How would you summarize the faults of the Pharisees and the lawyers? What attitude and action does Jesus recommend?
