Questions for Reflection

- What does Jesus say about temptation and the responsibility of those who cause it?
- What does Jesus teach about forgiveness? How is forgiving someone more like being a servant than a master?
- The disciples realize that they require greater faith than they think they have. What does Jesus teach them about the nature of faith?
- How does 17:7-10 illustrate the appropriate perspective for disciples to have toward God?
- How do you experience the tension between the kingdom being inaugurated by Jesus, but not yet fully realized even now?
- How do Jesus' words speak to followers of Jesus today amidst waiting and difficulties?


