## Questions for Reflection

- In vss. 1-14, how are the parables similar and different? When have you been utterly persistent about something? What kept you going?
- How do children demonstrate the kind of humble trust Jesus has been speaking of? What makes the rich ruler respond with sadness?
- What connection do you see between Jesus' radical demand (18:22, 29), and his own self-sacrifice (18:31-33)?
- Compare and contrast the blind beggar and Zacchaeus. What can we learn from the different way Jesus dealt with each, and their response?
- What does this parable say to us today as we await the final day of God's judgment, the final "coming" of Jesus to our world?


