Luke 21:37-38; 22:1-46 Questions for Reflection

- What can be learned from the part played by Judas, who was "one of the twelve?"
- What significance do you see in Jesus' death occurring at Passover time?
- In vss. 14-23, what indicates the purpose of Jesus' death?
- In vss. 24-30, how does Jesus idea of greatness contrast with the world's standards?
- How does Jesus show his care for others even as he faced the ordeal of his life?
- In vss. 39-46 Jesus faces the cross with hesitation and anguish. What do you think his concerns were?
- What do we learn about the disciples in this situation; what temptation does Jesus warn them against (vs. 40)?
