

Ukraine Briefing Luncheon Jones Hall (NPS Gymnasium)

Please join us immediately following the 11:00 am worship service as we continue our conversation with Dr. Ivan Rusyn, President of the Ukrainian Evangelical Theological Seminary (our guest speaker at this morning's Summer Speaker Series). Since the first days of the full-scale war, Ivan and others from the seminary have provide regular worship and communion to Ukrainian troops close to the frontlines. The seminary has been very involved in ministry to service members through their training in trauma counseling.
