Presently serving as the 62nd Chaplain of the House of Respresentatives, Chaplain Margaret Grun Kibben was elected by House Membership and sworn in by the Speaker of the House on 3 January 2021.

A Navy chaplain for 35 years, Rear Admiral Kibben's Navy and Marine Corps assignments were comprised of tours up and down the east coast, a quick trip out west, and several deployments, to include Afghanistan. Rear Admiral Kibben was the U.S. Navy's 26th Chief of Chaplains, and the 18th Chaplain of the Marine Corps and Deputy Chief of Chaplains.

A native of Warrington, Pennsylvania, Dr. Kibben earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Goucher College, Towson, Maryland and Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary, Princeton, New Jersey, and a Master's degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College, Newport, Rhode Island. Dr. Kibben served as a senior fellow, United States Institute of Peace, Washington, D.C.

Chaplain Kibben serves on both military and civilian boards and is a Faculty Advisor for Arizona State University's Master of Arts program in International Affairs and Leadership.

# Heritage Brief

### AM RADIO STATION WDM

A milestone in the history of the Church of the Covenant—one of National's predecessor congregations—was having the first licensed radio station in the United States operated by a religious institution, with its inaugural broadcast on Sunday afternoon, January 1, 1922. Dr. Charles Wood, our Senior Minister at the time, felt that listeners could benefit by the worship services being broadcast beyond the sanctuary, as the number of homes with radios was growing at that point. Operating as AM station WDM, the church purchased and installed a complete transmission radio system, with broadcast aerials snaked through the church tower at our location on Connecticut Avenue.

A most unusual broadcast occurred on the evening of Wednesday, September 6, 1922, when the wedding of John and Helen Collier was heard by "thousands of radio fans in the Eastern Section of the United States"! John was a member of the Collier family that served as sextons for the church for decades, and later he wrote that it was the "first wedding ceremony to be broad-cast over the air by radio."

WDM remained licensed until the spring of 1925 when the church dropped its license, and its transmitter is now in the collection of the Smithsonian Institution. Later, radio broadcasts by local stations of church services—including our own—became a staple of towns and cities all across America, and today our services are carried live on the internet worldwide, but a century ago the Church of the Covenant was at the forefront of this medium, with our own licensed radio station.
