# **Today's Flowers**

The flowers in the Sanctuary are given with grateful hearts to the glory of God by Donald and Marcia F. Bini, in loving memory of their mothers, Hilda E. Bini and Ione S. Freeman, remembering their September birthdays.



We all have different talents and passions. Flying was a love of one of our former ministers, Dr. Louis Evans, Jr., who served as senior pastor from 1973 to 1991. During his tenure at National he frequently spoke about flying, and wove his enthusiasm for aviation into his sermons. He also found a creative way for his avocation as a pilot to make a consequential, even life-saving, difference in peoples' lives.

In 1972, two pilots — one an engineer and career federal officer and the other our own Dr. Evans prior to his call to National — discovered that they shared a common passion for piloting airplanes and serving people. In a conversation over lunch in downtown DC, Edward Boyer, of the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (since 1980 Health and Human Services), and Dr. Evans, pooled their interests and qualifications to conceive a plan that eventually became a charitable air ambulance service. Initially they used borrowed or rented aircraft for sporadic patient flights. Over time, they realized they needed to purchase their own airplane.



In 1977, Dr. Evans, Mr. Boyer, and two other pilots purchased a Beechcraft Bonanza six-seat aircraft, and the Washington Aviation Ministry was born. The Ministry has undergone many changes and today it is known as Angel Flight Mid-Atlantic. From its beginnings as a charitable shuttle service for church workers and missionaries, the initial vision has grown into a network of 1,500 volunteer pilots in the Mid-Atlantic region who use their private planes to fly people in need for specialized treatment. Angel Flights coordinates missions of mercy from its offices in Virginia Beach, helping patients to find "the shortest distance between home and hope."

In 2014 friends of Louis Evans donated funds to recognize Dr. Evans for his passion as a volunteer pilot. His name is engraved on a memorial plaque on display at the National Air and Space Museum—The Udvar-Hazy Center at Dulles International Airport.
