Heritage Brief

SIGNIFICANT OCTOBER EVENTS OF OUR CONGREGATION







First Presbyterian Church

The Church of the Covenant

National Prebyterian Church

October 13, 1792: Local stonemasons laid the White House cornerstone, joined by expert Scottish stonemasons in 1794. These craftsmen began worshiping in a carpenter's shed on the White House grounds in 1795, forming the nucleus of what would become The First Presbyterian Church of Washington by 1812 — the first parent congregation of NPC.

October 13, 1885: The Church of the Covenant was formally organized with 58 charter members. Its roots trace to 1883, when 11 men from New York Avenue Presbyterian Church met at Supreme Court Justice William Strong's home to establish a church for the growing Northwest population. A Romanesque-style building at Connecticut Ave. and N St., NW was completed in 1889. In 1930, it merged with First Presbyterian to form Covenant-First Presbyterian Church.


October 10, 1927: After over a century of discussions, the Presbyterian General Assembly chartered The National Presbyterian Church, Inc. under Maryland law to serve as a spiritual home for national leaders and represent Presbyterian values in public life. It would be another two decades before such a designated church would be a reality.

October 19, 1947: President Harry Truman dedicated Covenant-First Presbyterian Church as The National Presbyterian Church, urging a postwar moral and spiritual revival. A plaque marking the occasion is now displayed near the Chapel entrance.

October 14, 1967: With the Connecticut Ave. location outgrown, former President Dwight D. Eisenhower helped lay the cornerstone for a new church on Nebraska Ave., NW on the former Hillcrest Children's Center site. Worship continued in temporary space until the sanctuary opened in 1969, alongside the founding of The National Presbyterian School.

October 17, 2021: Dr. David Renwick led a celebration marking the completion of a major capital project that modernized NPC's aging infrastructure, upgrading our facilities to include a central staircase, new elevators, a main entrance, Garden Rooms, a new library, Welcome Center, nursery, and renovated Youth House. Prior to construction, \$1 million was given to support local and global mission efforts.
