THE STORY OF OUR CAMPUS: HILLCREST CHILDREN'S HOME

Our NPC campus once served as an orphanage. In 1815, the **Washington City Orphan Asylum** — one of the city's first charitable organizations — was founded to provide a home for girls left homeless by the War of 1812. Prominent women benefactors, including First Lady Dolley Madison, Marcia Van Ness, and Margaret Bayard Smith, sought to give these children a Christian upbringing and vocational training.

Another key supporter was Eleanor White, the wife of the founding pastor of the congregation that grew out of the White House stonemasons' Sunday worship gatherings and became First Presbyterian Church, one of our predecessor congregations.

The Orphan Asylum's first home was a rented four-bedroom house on 10th Street, N.W., where Mrs. Brackenridge lived temporarily until a matron was hired. Later, the Asylum moved to a purpose-built facility on H Street, on land donated by Mrs. Van Ness.

The organization expanded over the decades, admitting boys in 1879 and outgrowing multiple facilities. In 1920, philanthropist Edwin Gould donated \$225,000 to purchase a 13-acre vacant lot on Nebraska Avenue, N.W. Architect Appleton P. Clark, Jr. designed a campus of seven buildings; four were completed. First Lady Grace Coolidge presided over the ribbon-cutting ceremony in 1926, and the children moved in the following year. The new home became known as **Hillcrest Children's Village**, with Van Ness Street later established to provide an additional entrance from Nebraska Avenue.

By the 1960s, the Hillcrest cottages no longer met the needs of the organization's evolving mission. The property was sold to become the site of the **National Presbyterian Church**. Architect Harold E. Wagoner incorporated the Hillcrest cottages into his new campus design. The four original Cotswold Cottage–style buildings that once housed children remain today:

- **Dolley Madison Cottage** now serves as our main administrative offices and is connected to **Gould Cottage**, which houses the **National Presbyterian School**.
- Van Ness Cottage is now the Agencies Building (because it was initially intended to house various denominational agencies of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America).
- The fourth building continues to be known as the Multi-Purpose Building.

Together, the 1920s designs by Clark and the 1960s additions by Wagoner form a unified campus that is now recognized as a D.C. Historic Landmark.

After selling the property, Hillcrest Children's Center relocated, first to W Street, N.W., and later to its current home at 915 Rhode Island Avenue, N.W., where it continues as the Hillcrest Children and Family Center, providing vital health care and social services to the community.
