Club 45 (fourth and fifth graders) meets regularly to grow in faith and friendship through games and devotionals.

Vacation Bible School (VBS)

VBS is a week-long half-day Bible camp June 22-26 for kids age 4 through 5th grade. Each day includes Bible teaching, music, crafts, games and service projects.

Youth

Middle and high school students gather regularly for fun games, meaningful conversation, and Bible study.

Youth Summer Trips

Middle school youth will attend a summer conference to learn more about Christ and grow in faith together. High school youth will serve on a mission trip in the Dominican Republic.

Young Professionals

Each week, young professionals gather for a Bible study that focuses on applying faith to daily life in Washington DC, as well as for periodic social events.

Parents

During the Sunday school hour, parents are invited to drop in to Parent Gathering for coffee, fellowship, and Bible study of the passages being read in children's and youth Sunday school. There are also regular parent small groups open to join.

Great Day of Service and Mission Trips

There are year-round opportunities to serve, including a special day of service with family-friendly, hands-on projects both onsite and in the surrounding community. Additionally, there will be a summer Mission Trip to Romania.
