The Apostle Paul writes

<sup>18</sup> I, Paul, will not venture to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me to win obedience from the Gentiles, by word and deed, <sup>19</sup>by the power of signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God, so that from Jerusalem and as far around as Illyricum I have fully proclaimed the good news of Christ. <sup>20</sup>Thus I make it my ambition to proclaim the good news, not where Christ has already been named, so that I do not build on someone else's foundation, <sup>21</sup>but as it is written,

'Those who have never been told of him shall see, and those who have never heard of him shall understand.'

<sup>22</sup> This is the reason that I have so often been hindered from coming to you. <sup>23</sup>But now, with no further place for me in these regions, I desire, as I have for many years, to come to you <sup>24</sup>when I go to Spain.
