Welcome to Rev. Dr. Brian K. Blount

We welcome back to National the Rev. Dr. Brian K. Blount, president and professor of New Testament at Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond, VA. Dr. Blount was called to this position in 2007 after serving for 15 years as the Professor of New Testament at Princeton Seminary.

Dr. Blount obtained his B.A. from the College of William and Mary in 1978, where he became the first African-American member of the Alpha Chapter of the Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society. From 1982-85 he served as the pastor of the Carver Memorial Presbyterian Church in Newport News, VA, before attending Emory University where he received his Ph.D. in New Testament in 1992. His primary work has been in the Gospel of Mark, the Book of Revelation and in the area of cultural studies and hermeneutics. He is the author of many articles, six books and is the General Editor for *True To Our Native Land: An African American New Testament Commentary* by Fortress Press.
