- The Grace of God and Human sin/weakness
- Service over Force
- Listening over "Being Right"

Today – Romans 2-3

B. The depth & Perniciousness of Sin

I. Human Blindness to sin – Hard to see if we are privileged

- \rightarrow e.g., Jesus and the Rich Ruler (Matthew 19:16-22)
- \rightarrow e.g. God's ancient Chosen People (Romans 2-3)

Romans 2:10-19

A Relentless Exposing the worst of sin *in God's own people* Using quotes (Psalms, Isaiah, Proverbs) *from their Bible*

II. Human Blindness to Sin – Hard to Admit when we are privileged

- a. Tendency to create Self-Esteem via Comparisons with others
- b. Tendency for *Excuses, Exceptions, Caveats* for our special case e.g., God gave US the Bible! We know God and God's will

We have the signs of God's love (circumcision, baptism, etc)

- c. Paul:
 - Having and doing are two different things (Romans 2)
 - Our Bible says (Rom.2:24/Isaiah 56:2) "My name is blasphemed among the gentiles because of you!"
 - NO EXCEPTIONS: <u>ALL are accountable to God</u> (3:19)

III. Privilege means More Accountability

- a. Is God's Name blasphemed in the Secular world because of us?
 - -- the link in recent riots to Christian faith
 - -- Not dwelling on comparisons or "distancing"
 - -- the need to seek God's help to work harder to be faithful witnesses for Christ

b. <u>Are we more blind to "White Privilege" than we see, admit, realize</u>?

-- the Tendency to superiority (more prevalent than to "supremacy")

-- The Excuses (as in Romans 2-3): we were here first, we made the society great, we created and interpreted the law . . .
