

The Overlap of the Ages (NOW!)

THIS WEEK... the word is.. <u>7.</u> <u>LAW</u> (x 31)

Promise, Scripture ("It is Written"), Covenant, Circumcision

Alas!!!

= Multiple meanings for the word "LAW" in the New Testament

e.g.

"Law" = an array of things

→ to which one can be "subject" or "under."

(1) The <u>Rules of Moses</u> (laws as specific precepts and ordinances)

- (2) Or –The Books Moses
- (3) Or (broader) All the OT Books
- (3) Or -a specific promise (curse?) or covenant

e.g. in Galatians and elsewhere in Scripture . .

- i. The Law as something people can "be subject to" or "live under"
 - o Galatians 4^{4,5} But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born *under the law*, in order to redeem those who were *under the law*, so that we might receive adoption as children.
 - o Galatians 4²¹ Tell me, you who desire to be *subject to the law*, will you not *listen to the law*?

The Law as "Specific Rules given in the Five Books of Moses"

- Luke 10²⁵ (a man asks) What must I do to inherit eternal life? ²⁶Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" (the reply comes from rules given in two Books of Moses = Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18)
- O 1 Corinthians 9⁸ (Paul) Do I say this on human authority? Does not the law also say the same? ⁹For it is written in the law of Moses "You shall not muzzle an ox while it is treading out the grain. (from a Book of Moses, Deuteronomy 25:4).

The Law as "Scripture"

Note:

Our Old Testament

Comprises of three parts:

- 1. The Five Book of Moses
- 2. The Prophets
- **3. The Writings** (Psalms, etc.)

ii. The Law as "Scripture"

1. = the $\underline{Books \ of \ Mose}$ s, as distinct from the \underline{Books} $\underline{of \ the \ Prophets}$

- Matthew 5¹⁷ (<u>Jesus</u>) Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill.
- Acts 28²³After they (the Jewish leaders in Rome) had set a day to meet with <u>Paul</u>, they came to him at his lodgings in great numbers. From morning until evening, he explained the matter to them, testifying to the kingdom of God and trying to convince them about Jesus both <u>from the law of Moses</u> and from the prophets.
- NOTE: Galatians 4 <u>Paul</u> refers not just to "rules" in Genesis as the "law" but to <u>stories</u> about Abraham

ii. The Law as "Scripture"

- 2. Including all the OT: both *the Prophets and Writings*!
 - John 10³⁴ <u>Jesus</u> answered, "Is it not <u>written</u> <u>in your law</u>, 'I said, you are gods'?
 (→ <u>Psalm 82:6</u>)
 - O 1 Corinthians 14²¹ (**Paul**) *In the law it is* written, "By people of strange tongues and by the lips of foreigners I will speak to this people; yet even then they will not listen to me," says the Lord.
 - $(\rightarrow \underline{Isaiah\ 28:11}; see\ also\ Isaiah\ 54:1\ in\ Gal.4:27).$

But here is a puzzle:

In Galatians . . . The law also seems to be something "inside" and "distinct from" the Scripture!

Romans 3²¹

But now, apart from law

→ apart from Scripture? Unlikely! the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets (= by the Scripture)

- .. so ...
- iii. The Law here is not a book in the Bible or rules, BUT
 - a covenant/specific commitment

- made with God/Moses/People
- **at Mt. Sinai** (*Exodus 24:1-8*)

3:17: the law,

- which came four hundred thirty years later (*after Abraham*),
- does not nullify <u>a covenant</u> previously ratified by God (<u>with Abraham</u>),
- o so as to nullify the promise (made to Abraham)

Note Sequence/Connection:

→ Law→Covenant→Promise

Exodus 24:3-8 At Mount Sinai:

³Moses came and told the people *all the words of the Lord*

and all the ordinances (rules);

and all the people answered with one voice, and said, "All the words that the Lord has spoken we will do."

⁴And Moses wrote down all the words of the Lord. He rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and *set up twelve pillars*, *corresponding to the twelve tribes of Israel*. (*the community is formed by this covenant / constitution*) ⁵He sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed oxen as offerings of well-being to the Lord. ⁶Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he dashed against the altar.

⁷Then he took **the book of the covenant**, and read it in the hearing of the people;

and they said, (made a promise!!)

"All that the Lord has spoken

we will do, and we will be obedient."

⁸Moses took the blood and dashed it on the people, and said, "See the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words."

What are the blessings of this covenant?

- → God is everywhere BUT
- -- in the Tabernacle <u>access</u> is provided to God's *intimate presence* (*highly controlled and limited see Rom* 5:1-2)
- → 630 commandments to follow
- → most, liturgical =
- → building and maintaining worship in the Tabernacle



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And yet . . we have another puzzle

- The people (descendants of a man called Abraham) have been God's people (in covenant with God) for 400+ years -- since the time of Abraham.
- The human sign of the God's special relationship (covenant) with Abraham and his descendants— was circumcision -- established centuries ago.

Listen . . .

Genesis 17.5-14

(God said to Abraham)

⁷I will establish **my covenant** <u>between me and you,</u> <u>and your offspring</u> after you throughout their generations,

for <u>an everlasting covenant</u>, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

⁸And I will give to you, and to your offspring after you, the land where you are now an alien, all the land of Canaan, for a perpetual holding; and I will be their God."

⁹God said to Abraham, "As for you, <u>you shall keep</u> <u>my covenant</u>, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations.

¹⁰This is **my covenant**, which you shall keep, between me and you and your offspring after you: .

¹²Throughout your generations every male among you shall be <u>circumcised</u> when he is eight days old, including the slave born in your house and the one bought with your money <u>from any foreigner</u> who is not of your offspring. ¹³Both the slave born in your house and the one bought with your money must be circumcised.

So shall my covenant be in your flesh an everlasting covenant.

¹⁴Any uncircumcised male who is not circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin shall be cut off from his people;

he has broken my covenant."

And this passage/ story/ commandment) in Scripture raises a question . . .

Is the covenant – and the covenant sign -- only for physical descendants of Israel? Or for all people?

The God of Abraham is clearly interested in ALL PEOPLE

Genesis 15:5

⁵ God brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶And he believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Genesis 17.4-5

⁴ "This is my covenant with you (says the Lord): You shall be the <u>ancestor of a multitude of</u> nations.

(nations in GK= "gentiles"/ethnics) ⁵No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you *the ancestor of a multitude of nations*. ⁶I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and *I will make nations of you*, and kings shall come from you.

+

Ezekiel 44.6-9

Let there be an end to the abominations <u>in</u> <u>admitting foreigners</u>, <u>uncircumcised</u> in heart and flesh, to be in my sanctuary

Isaiah 52.1:

Awake, awake, put on your strength, O Zion! Put on your beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city; for the **uncircumcised** and the unclean shall enter you no more.

In the light of these Scriptures ("the Law") Does Paul think the welcome of the Gentiles into God's family involves circumcision? *NO!*

Galatians 5

2-4: Listen! I, Paul, am telling you that if you let yourselves be **circumcised**, Christ will be of no benefit to you.

Once again I testify to every man who lets himself be <u>circumcised</u> that he is obliged to obey the entire *law*.

You who want to be justified by the *law* have cut yourselves off from Christ;

you have fallen away from grace (gift!).

6: For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor **uncircumcision** counts for anything;

the only thing that counts is faith working through love.

11: But my friends, why am I still being persecuted if I am still preaching <u>circumcision</u>? In that <u>case the offense of the cross</u> has been removed.

Galatians 6

12: It is those who want to make a good showing in the flesh that try to compel you to be **circumcised**—only that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ.

13: Even the <u>circumcised</u> do not themselves obey the law, but they want you to be <u>circumcised</u> so that they may boast about your flesh.

15: For neither circumcision nor <u>uncircumcision</u> is anything; but a new creation is everything!

But (*Paul's opponents might say*)

if the Gentiles aren't circumcised, aren't they missing out on a right relationship with – access to – God?

NO! says Paul..

There is "now" (since Jesus came) a different/new covenant

A new means of "access" for "all flesh" (Jews & Gentiles).

WHY?!

Did God make a mistake the first time round? Or

Was the first covenant limited in some way, for a reason? Or for a season?

One limitation of the Old Covenant → The Problem of Death

= the Original Law/Covenant with "all flesh" in Genesis 2 . .

Genesis 2:8-9, 15-17,24

8And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed. 9Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow *every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food*,

the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

15The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.

16And the Lord God <u>commanded the man</u>, "<u>You</u> <u>may freely eat</u> of every tree of the garden; 17but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, <u>for in the day that you eat of it you shall</u> <u>die.</u>"

24 God drove out the man;

and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim, and a sword flaming and turning -- to guard the way to the tree of life.

The solution comes only with the . . <u>Incarnation</u> and <u>Death of Jesus</u>

Galatians 3

13: Christ redeemed us from the curse of the *law*

(referring to Genesis 2:16-17?)

by becoming a curse for us

—for it is written

(in the LAW, in Deuteronomy 21:23)

"Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"

So – Why – Paul's opponents ask . . Why did God bother with the Abraham/Moses covenant?

- → and not go straight to the covenant established by Jesus?
- Good Question!!
- .. that Paul addresses in Gal.3

Galatians 3

19: Why then the (Mosaic Covenant) *law*? It was added because of transgressions, *until* the offspring would come to whom the *promise* had been made; and it was ordained through angels by a mediator.

21: Is the (Mosaic Covenant) *law* then opposed to the *promises* of God? Certainly not! For if a (Covenant) *law* had been given that could make alive, then righteousness would indeed come *through the law* (as Scripture?).

23: Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the (Mosaic Covenant) *law* until faith would be revealed. 24: Therefore the (Mosaic Covenant) *law* was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith.



GALATIANS 1

1 Paul -- An apostle

- Not from people
- Nor through people
- But through Jesus Christ and God-Father,
- the one raising him (Jesus) from the dead

2 And the ones with me -- all the brothers To the churches of Galatia



3 Grace [gift] to **you all** and peace from God our father and the Lord Jesus Christ . . .

- 1. 4 the one giving himself
 - a. on behalf of our sins
- Who has delivered us from the age of the present evil
- 3. according to the will
 of our God and father5 to whom be glory
 into the age of the ages; amen!

6 I am astonished that thus quickly you all have deserted (= personal)

[OR "transferred from" (= spatial)]

the one calling you [all]
in/by the grace [gift] of Christ
into another gospel

-- 7 Which there is not another

Except/but there are some

- the ones troubling you
- and wishing to alter/pervert the gospel of Christ

8 But even if we

or an angel [messenger] from heaven
 Should proclaim good news to ("gospelize") you
 [all] apart from
 what we proclaiming good news to you [all] → let
 them be accursed
 9As we said before and also now again I say
 If anyone is proclaiming good news to
 ("gospelizing") you [all] apart from what you all

→ let him be accursed.

received

10 Q. Am I now appeasing people or God?

Am I really seeking to please people?

A. If I was still (seeking to) please people I would not be a servant [slave] of Christ

11 Indeed, I want you all to know, brothers:
That the good news [gospel]
being proclaimed as good news [gospelized] by me -- (it) is not "according to people."

12 In fact,

- 1. in no way did I receive it from people
- 2. nor was I taught it
- 3. but I received it <u>through a revelation of</u>

 <u>Jesus Christ</u> . . . →

[Acts 9, 22, 26]

26:14 When we had all fallen to the ground, I heard a voice saying to me in the Hebrew language, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me? It hurts you to kick against the goads.' 15I asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The Lord answered, 'I am Jesus whom you are persecuting. 16But get up and stand on your feet; for I have appeared to you for this purpose, to appoint you to serve and testify to the things in which you have seen me and to those in which I will appear to you. 171 will rescue you from your people and from the Gentiles—to whom I am sending you 18to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.'

- 13 (2) For you have heard about my former way of life, in Judaism:
- -- that, according to superabundance
- I persecuted the church of God
- and I tried to destroy them.
- 14 And I advanced in Judaism above many contemporaries in my people [race/nation/class] being overflowingly zealous for the traditions of my ancestors

15 But when God

- -- the one who <u>set me apart</u> from my mother's womb
- -- and called (me)

through his grace [gift]
was pleased 16 to reveal His son in me
in order that I might proclaim
the good news [about] him
among the gentiles (ethnics!)

The first thing I did was ...


- 1. NOT to consult with flesh and blood
- 2. 17 NOR did I go up into Jerusalem to the "before me apostles"
- BUT I went away into Arabia and again I returned into Damascus

18 Then -- after three years
I went up to Jerusalem

to visit **Cephas** (Simon Peter)

And I remained with him 2 weeks --

19 Other of the apostles I did not see -- except



James the brother of the Lord

- (what I am writing to you 20let me be clear)
- I write

 <u>as one</u>

 <u>standing in</u>

 <u>the presence</u>

 <u>of God</u>:
- <u>I am</u>
 not lying
 21 Then . . I
 went into
 the regions

of Syria and Cilicia

22 (and) I was unknown by face to the churches of the Jews/Judeans

- -- the ones in Christ
- 23 Except that they were hearing that "The one once persecuting us is now proclaiming-the good-news of the faith

which he once sought to destroy."
And they were glorifying God in me.
CHAPTER 2

1 Then

after 14 years

again I went up to *Jerusalem* with Barnabas, taking along also Titus.
