Sermon Notes A Passion for What's Right and Fair

Great Ends of the Church: Promotion of Social Righteousness James 1:27, 2:12-20; Amos 5: 18-24 The National Presbyterian Church David A. Renwick, February 23, 2014

THEMES

1. Definitions

- a. Righteousness: What's right, fair, or just in any given circumstance
- b. Biblical Righteousness: (1) What's right in God's sight, and (2) what's fair and just for our neighbor in any given circumstance
- c. Being Biblically Righteous: not just (1) Doing the right thing; but (2) Being rightly related to someone (e.g., God or neighbor)

2. Importance:

- a. Pursuing worship without social righteousness in a society in which much is wrong *is abhorrent to God*
- b. Pursuing social righteousness is a major theme in (i) the Old Testament, (ii) with Jesus, and (iii) in our Presbyterian heritage (Calvin)

3. Implementation: How?

- a. Escaping from political partisanship
- b. Maintaining a truly Biblical foundation
- c.Creating church community that is righteous

MOSES

- Deuteronomy 15:11 Since there will never cease to be some in need on the earth, I therefore command you, "Open your hand to the **poor** and needy neighbor in your land."
- Deuteronomy 24:19-21 When you reap your harvest in your field and forget a sheaf in the field, you shall not go back to get it; it shall be left for the **alien**, the **orphan**, and the **widow**, so that the LORD your God may bless you in all your undertakings.
- Deuteronomy 27:19 "Cursed be anyone who deprives the <u>alien</u>, the <u>orphan</u>, and the <u>widow</u> of justice." All the people shall say, "Amen!"

THE PROPHETS

- Isaiah 1:15-17 Even though you make many prayers, I will not listen . . cease to do evil, learn to do good; seek justice, plead for the widow.
- 3:14-15 The LORD enters into judgment with the elders and princes of his people . . What do you mean by crushing my people, by grinding the face of the **poor**? says the Lord GOD of hosts.
- Isaiah 11:4 but with righteousness he shall judge the **poor**, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;

- Isaiah 58:6-7 Is not this the fast that I choose: Is it not to <u>share your bread with the hungry</u>, and bring the homeless <u>poor</u> into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?
- Jeremiah 22:15-16:Are you a king because you compete in cedar? Did not your father eat and drink and <u>do justice and righteousness</u>? Then it was well with him. He judged the cause of the **poor** and needy; then it was well. Is not this to know me? says the Lord
- Jeremiah 29:7 Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile; pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
- Ezekiel 16:49 This was the guilt of Sodom: she and her daughters had pride, excess of food, and prosperous ease, but did not aid the **poor** and needy.
- Amos 2:7, 5:24 they who trample the head of the **poor** into the dust of the earth, and push the afflicted out of the way; (5:24) BUT let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream
- <u>Micah 6:8</u> God has told you what is good; what does the Lord require of you? **Do** *justice, Love kindness, and Walk humbly with your God*!
- Zechariah 7:10 do not oppress the <u>widow</u>, the <u>orphan</u>, the <u>alien</u>, or the <u>poor</u>
 Malachi 3:5 I will be swift to bear witness . . . against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the <u>widow</u> and the <u>orphan</u>, against those who thrust aside the <u>alien</u>, and do not fear me, says the LORD of hosts.

Malachi 3:10 bring the full tithe into my storehouse

THE NEW TESTAMENT

Mark 12:40 They devour <u>widow</u>s' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."

Luke 4:18 jesus said: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the **poor**.

Luke 6:20 Jesus said: "Blessed are the **poor**: yours is the kingdom of God.

Acts 6:1 Now during those days, when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their **widow**s were being neglected in the **daily distribution of food**.

Romans 15:26 for Macedonia and Achaia have been pleased to **share** their **resources** with the **poor** among the saints at Jerusalem.

James 1:27 Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for **orphan**s and **widow**s in their distress . . .
