1. In Romans 6-8, Paul teaches about

a. Jesus' Death:

A death with purpose

- For us,
- Freeing us from God's condemnation (8:1)
- b. Jesus' Resurrection:

God's affirmation of Jesus –

- who he was (Son of God)
- what he accomplished (atonement)

God's affirmation of US –

- Guarantees our future resurrection with Christ
- c. Jesus' Ongoing Presence Now
 - By His Spirit in us, bringing an inescapable conviction
 - That we need God's help
 - That we've been gifted by God to serve
 - That we've been given power to grow in character
 - That we truly belong to God's family as His children

2. In Romans 8:15-25 Paul . . . (*Today*)

a. Teaches about Suffering

- Not the "Why?" of suffering
- But the "How?" -- How do I cope with suffering?
- b. Teaches from His Own Experience
 - Suffered so much that others thought he was under God's judgment
 - Describes his suffering especially in 2 Corinthians
 1:8-11, 4:7-18, 11:24-30, 12:7-10

c. Shares Two Thoughts that strengthened him as he suffered

- ... about God's Sovereignty over Time and the Future
- In the Future God will bring suffering to an end
- In the Future God will do something so spectacular that all present suffering will fade into insignificance

Key Verse: Romans 8:18 "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us."

The Jewish/Christian Understanding Of Divine Time:
