Guest Preacher, Dr. John Huffman

John Huffman was ordained at New York's Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church and has both a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry from Princeton Theological Seminary. He now serves as the "Minister at Large" of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Newport Beach, California, the chairman of the boards of *Christianity Today* and Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, and on the Pension Committee of the PCUSA Board of Pensions. He has written nine books, the most recent of which are *A Most Amazing Call* (available electronically through amazon.com), *The Family You Want* and *Forgive Us Our Prayers*. Among his many Presbyterian Church (USA) ministries, he has twice been moderator of his presbytery, has three times been a commissioner to General Assembly, and has served on four major task forces of the General Assembly. Dr. Huffman travels extensively throughout the world, meeting with international leaders in business, journalism, education, religion, politics, and humanitarian relief.
