World Communion Sunday was first celebrated in 1933. In perhaps the bleakest year of the Great Depression as storm clouds of Nazism and Fascism hovered over Europe, an American Presbyterian congregation in Pittsburgh sought to counteract widespread pessimism in society. They invited other congregations to join them in a celebration of Christian unity in the Lordship of Jesus Christ by gathering together at the Lord's Table. World Communion was adopted as a denomination-wide practice in 1936. During the Second World War the idea really caught hold. At a time when the world was coming apart, World Communion held things together spiritually. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate from the beginning; in 1940 the National Council of Churches endorsed World Communion and began to promote its celebration in Christian churches around the world. Three generations later amidst familiar anxieties over different world events, the celebration of Christ's presence at the Lord's Table continues to bear witness to the source of true hope.

The flowers in the Sanctuary are given to the glory of God on this World Communion Sunday when Christians all around the world gather together to celebrate at the Lord's table.
