World Communion Sunday was first celebrated in 1933. As storm clouds hovered over Europe, Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh sought to counteract widespread pessimism in society by inviting other congregations to join them in a celebration of Christian unity in the Lordship of Jesus Christ by gathering together at the Lord's Table. World Communion was adopted as a denomination-wide practice in 1936, and since then has spread to Christian churches all around the world.

The flowers in the Sanctuary are given to the glory of God on this World Communion Day when we partake of Holy Communion with Christians around the world, and also celebrate the 30th anniversary of the wedding of Lora Tredway and John Gregg at NPC officiated by Louis Evans, Jr.
