This prayer has been the basis for profound musical expression, as in today's selection from Schubert's *Mass No. 2 in G.*

Next Sunday we will be able to enjoy the return of chimes to the sanctuary organ. They will ring once more, following a long absence after earthquake damage. NPC organist William Neil will offer a brief demonstration shortly after the 11 a.m. service for those who would like to hear them and other new organ "voices" recently installed.
