He was appointed by the PC(USA) in 1999. Darren studied the politics and economics of the Middle East as an undergraduate at Princeton University. He earned his M.Div. at Princeton Theological Seminary and later his Ph.D. from the University of Edinburgh. His doctoral work on the providence of God was published in 2011 under the title Providence and Personalism. He is married to Dr. Elisabeth Kennedy and has two sons.
