- The most important part of the proposed facilities plan for most was the new entrance and the accessibility provided by the new elevators and central staircase.
- The majority of focus group participants did not believe that any parts of the proposed plans were unnecessary.
- Only 2% believed the plan was moving in the wrong direction.
- Over 510 individuals attended a focus group meeting to learn more about the proposed plans.
