- Over 510 individuals attended a focus group in September and October.
- The Facilities Master Planning Team has been carefully reviewing all your comments from the focus groups.
- The Readiness Assessment report showed that the plan presented by the Facilities Master Planning Team had broad support within the congregation.
- The Session approved entering a capital campaign to fund the proposed building improvements to NPC.
