## Finance Report: Thank You!

Thanks to your generous financial support, NPC had a strong finish in 2017. Preliminary numbers show total operating expenditures for the church were under budget at \$5,017,000. Congregational giving to the operating budget totaled \$2,862,000, an increase of 4% over 2016. Additional revenues from facilities use, special income, bequests, exceptional giving, and budgeted transfers from our investment accounts will enable us to end the year with a small surplus.
