For reflection:

- Imagine God giving you the opportunity to ask him for anything you want. Solomon ("a man who had everything") was given just this opportunity and he asked God to give him a discerning, understanding heart. What would it look like if God gave that to you?
- Imagine what the presence of God in his Temple would look like? The Bible says that fire came down and the glory of the Lord filled the Temple. How might you respond to this?
- Solomon had it all, but domestic concerns (multiple wives as allowed by ancient custom) turned his heart from God. What has the potential of pulling you away from following God?
