#### For reflection:

- In 2 Kings we read repeatedly of leaders who did evil (or good, in the case of a few) in the sight of the Lord. If your life was summarized in a single sentence, what would it say? Is God part of your proudest accomplishment(s) in life?
- Hezekiah was faithful to God in the face of intense pressure and almost certain defeat.
   What lessons can we take from him in facing our problems?
- Israel and Judah were led by mostly unfaithful kings. Yet through Isaiah God promised to save them, by sending a servant who would suffer redemptively on their behalf. How do you see Jesus' life as a fulfillment of God's promise in Isaiah?
