For reflection:

- God's rebellious people had multiple opportunities to repent of their ways and turn back to God; but they didn't. Even though God's ways are clear, his people chose disobedience. Why do we continue down the path of rebellion, even when we know the consequences? In what area of your life do you need to change direction?
- Eventually the myriad opportunities for repentance end and God's judgment ensues. Do you have any sense of finality and accountability for the decisions you make?
- After God punishes his people, he reaches out, promising to restore them. How does the reality that God is pursuing you make you feel? How might you respond to God's invitation today?
