- An initial distribution of \$300,000 has been given to our Capital Campaign mission partners.
- Our architect (Beyer Blinder Belle), owners representatives (Requity Real Estate), civil engineering firm (Wiles Mensch Corporation), and general contractor (MCN Build), have been selected for our Capital Campaign Project.
