For reflection:

- God can even use a pagan king to accomplish the rebuilding of Jerusalem.
 If God wanted to act in a certain situation, could he move through you to accomplish his purposes? Can you think of examples?
- Amidst opposition, Nehemiah kept the people focused. How do you respond when things don't go as planned? How quickly do you give up when facing obstacles? God wants to use you to accomplish his purposes; the path won't always be easy.
- Though the walls were completed, hearts were in disrepair. With internal issues of our hearts, we must learn dependence on God. Which is easier to repair, issues on the outside or issues on the inside?
