For reflection:

- Jesus said we must "deny ourselves" and "take up our cross;" and if we seek to save our lives we will lose them (pp. 353f).
 What are the implications of these commands for your life (important relationships, your career, your discretionary time)?
- Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead; yet he would one day die again. Which definition of life do you live by: life as "the absence of death" or life as the "presence of Jesus?"
- Jesus entered Jerusalem and cleansed the temple; some had turned it from God's house into a place of corruption. If Jesus walked into our church... into your life... with what would He be most pleased? What corrections might He make?
