For reflection:

- When Jesus washed his disciples' feet, what was he trying to teach them? What hints does this give you about God's kingdom? Would it be easier for you to wash someone else's feet or for someone else to wash your feet? What makes the servant life of Jesus difficult to accept?
- In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus asked the Father to remove the cup, but then added, "Not my will but thine be done." How have you submitted to the Father's will?
- Jesus was surrounded by faithful and unfaithful followers at the end. Judas betrayed; Peter denied; the apostles fell asleep... and they all fled. When do you find yourself being Jesus' friend? When do you feel the pressure to betray, or deny? What do you do when you grow weary?
