Scripture Reading for September 16–22

Luke 31-44, 5:12-16

Questions for Reflection

- In vss. 31-44 above, what astonished people about Jesus? How is this related to his declaration in the previous week's passage (see 4:16-22, especially vs. 22)?
- Is there someone in your life who needs the compassionate touch of friendship and understanding?
- Note the rhythm in Jesus' actions. On the one hand, he is eager and makes himself available to heal. On the other hand, he withdraws from crowds and popularity to pray. How much value do you place on prayer in your life? How is this reflected in your daily priorities?
- What quiet place can you find for a regular place for prayer?
