Questions for Reflection

- Look for four attitudes that Jesus uses to illustrate the principle of love and mercy. What would these attitudes look like in your life?
- What would it mean if Jesus' modern followers actually embodied these ways of living? What might that look like in your life if you sought to practice these teachings of Jesus?
- How does the story of the wise and foolish builders speak to you? Can you think of when you have been foolish, and wise, in heeding Jesus' words?
- When is judging (discerning, setting limits) appropriate? Not appropriate? Why does Jesus say what he says?


