Questions for Reflection

- In Luke's gospel, a variety of characters have been introduced, and many of them are people of unlikely faith. Do you think of others (see 7:36-8:3)?
- How do vss. 4-8 offer a summary of Jesus' ministry with a variety of people?
- What experience do you have of the truth of this parable in your response to Jesus?
- Think of the people whom you encounter on a daily or weekly basis; what kinds of soil do you see represented? What can you do to sow the seed of the gospel effectively?
- What is your expectation of the coming kingdom of God? When you pray the Lord's Prayer, what do you imagine an answer to your prayer looking like?
