Scripture Reading for Nov. 18-24, 2019

Luke 17:11-19

#### Questions for Reflection

- What does it say about Jesus that he had a reputation such that the ten lepers even dared to approach him (though still from a distance)?
- Insofar as Jesus is increasingly revealing the dawning kingdom of God in Luke's gospel, what does his compassion and healing of outcasts say about that kingdom?
- Is there any indication that the nine lepers disobeyed Jesus? The nine who left Jesus were just as cured as the one who returned, but what does this one understand about Jesus that the other nine did not? Why do you think Luke specifies that the one who returned is a foreigner?
- How did the cured Samaritan leper approach Jesus? What attitude does his posture indicate?
- Do you see a relationship between humility before God and gratitude in your life?
