# Scripture Reading for December 2–8, 2019

Luke 1:39-2:20

### Questions for Reflection

- Jesus' first earthly worshippers, the shepherds, were just as unremarkable as his mother, yet they too were chosen by God to be the recipients of an angelic visit. What do the angel's message to the shepherds, and the rejoicing of the heavenly host the shepherds witnessed, indicate about Jesus' birth?
- Note the response of Mary and of the shepherds. How do you think Luke knew that Mary "treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart"? What does this mean for your understanding of Luke's narrative of Jesus' birth? When you have a sense of God doing something important, are you more likely to "ponder it in your heart" (like Mary), or glorify and praise God for what you have heard and seen (like the shepherds)?
