- What was Herod's reaction to news of the birth of a king of the Jews? Might "all Jerusalem" have been frightened by news of the birth of the new king?
- Herod's title gets lost after vss. 1 and 3.
   Which characters are introduced into the story in between these mentions that might warrant this change, and why?
- How do royal gifts further confirm Jesus identity as a newborn king?
- What is the significance of the birth of a legitimate king in the face of a false one?
- What are the implications of the visit of Gentile dignitaries for the reign of this new king of the Jews?
