The Salvation Army, an international movement founded in 1865, is a Protestant, evangelical part of the universal Christian Church. Its message is based on the Bible, its ministry is motivated by the love of God, and its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ as it seeks to meet human needs in his name without discrimination.

In an effort to attract people and to present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to outsiders, the Salvation Army's founder, William Booth, initially saw music as a means to an end, using his volunteer army to take music beyond the church walls and into the streets, primarily in the form of brass bands and vocalists. Music continues to be important to the Salvation Army's ministries of Christian education and evangelism.

In the United States, The Salvation Army is divided into four administrative sections, called territories. The Southern Territorial Songsters, formed in 1992, is comprised of both soldiers and officers from the 15 states of the Salvation Army's USA Southern Territory. The Songsters' current leader, Dr. Beatrice Holz, Professor Emeritus of Asbury University, began conducting the Songsters in the fall of 2015.

The Southern Territorial Songsters typically meet for musical ministry just three weekends each year to support major events within The Salvation Army. This weekend in the D.C. area is the annual "Thanks for Giving" Weekend – an opportunity to say "thank you" to all who support the ministries of The Salvation Army. National has collected special offerings for The Salvation Army several times throughout the years in response to natural disasters, most recently supporting The Salvation Army's relief efforts in the Bahamas.
