## Sermon Notes: Courage to Stand Alone David Renwick

## A. What to Do about "Difficult Bible Passages"

- 1. The "lens" through which we view the Old Testament is Jesus
  - a. Jesus clearly believes in our moral accountability and God's judgment (see Matthew 25)
  - b. But he also believes that
    - i. "taking ultimate justice into our hands" will do more harm than good (Matthew 13: 24-30)
    - ii. that the main weapon we wield to overcome evil is to be love (Matthew 543-45: Romans 12:21).
    - iii. the "promised land" we are now to seek is the "kingdom of God"
- 2. Even with the "lens" of Jesus moral complexity still remains for Christians
  - a. Presbyterians do not see the Bible as teaching pacifism
  - i. Neither Jesus nor John the Baptist call soldiers to abandon their arms (Luke 3:14; 7:1-10; Acts 10
  - ii. The government has the right to bear arms and has an obligation to use force if necessary to maintain justice (Romans 13:1)
  - b. Christians who wear "two ethical hats" e.g., serving both God and country –will at times be caught in ethical dilemmas between love and violence (see especially theologian Reinhold Niebuhr)
  - c. This will be true especially when evil is brutal, irrational and unbridled (as per Nazis, ISIS and the time of Moses)

#### B. The Power of God to

**Stop Murmuring** *and* **Stand with Courage against the Crowd** 

#### Numbers 14:6-8

Joshua and Caleb, who were among those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes 7 and said to all the congregation of the Israelites, "The land that we went through as spies is an exceedingly good land. 8 If the Lord is pleased with us, he will bring us into this land and give it to us, a land that flows with milk and honey. Only, do not rebel against the Lord; and do not fear the people of the land."

#### Says God to Moses

"Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today14The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to keep still." (Exodus 14:13, 14)

## Says God to Joshua

Be strong and bold; have no fear or dread of them, because it is the Lord your God who goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6)

#### Says the Psalmist to God in prayer

The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?

The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you . . what can flesh do to me? (Psalm 27:1-4)

## Says God through Isaiah

Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God;

I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. (Isaiah 41:10)

God gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless.

Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength (Isaiah 40:29, 31)

# **Says God through the Apostle Paul**

You did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. (Romans 8:15)

I can do all things through him who strengthens me. (Philippians 4:13)

God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-control. (2 Timothy 1:7)

#### Says God through Jesus (Luke 12:32)

Fear not, little flock: it is the Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom (the ultimate promised land).

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
