Upcoming Chapel Hallway Construction - No anticipated impact on Sunday activities

On September 22, construction will begin on the hallway outside the Chapel in the main church building to repair a leak in the ceiling. Due to the nature of the work and the material of the ceiling, this work will include asbestos abatement. This construction will likely not affect any proceedings on Sundays, it will only occur during the week. We have selected a licensed asbestos abatement contractor to perform this work, and all work will be conducted in accordance with health and safety regulations.
